

## **NOTE TO INDUSTRY (NTI)**

Purpose: This Note to Industry (NTI) serves as a notice to inform relevant stakeholders of the notification of any unsafe lifting equipment.

The Safety, Health and Environment National Authority (SHENA) hereby announce that **Authorised Examiners (AEs)** (including Third-Party Inspection Agencies (TPIAs)) are required to inform SHENA, as soon as reasonably practicable, if the examination shows that the lifting equipment cannot continue to be used safely (which can cause an imminent risk of serious personal injury) unless repairs are made.

This is a requirement under Regulations 19(13)(c)(i), 20(9)(c)(i), and 21(15)(c)(i) of the Workplace Safety and Health (General Provisions), 2014. Additionally, reference is made to Regulation 45 of the Workplace Safety and Health (General Provisions), 2014 whereby it states that any person who contravenes any provision of these Regulations which imposes a duty on him is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$20,000, imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years or both.

Kindly note that the term 'lifting equipment' includes hoists and lifts, lifting gears, lifting appliances, and lifting machines.

The notification of any unsafe lifting equipment is to be made **online** via the SHENA website under the 'Licenses & Registrations' tab by selecting the respective webpages as listed below where applicable, or by using the QR Code as provided below:

- Authorised Examiner (AE) for Lifting Equipment
- Third-Party Inspection Agency (TPIA) for Lifting Equipment
